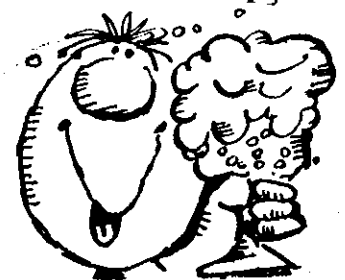

A short dump story from Dick

I would like to share with you a dumping trip I went on back in 1977. It was a 3 day hunt with my son. We sure had good luck and a good time on that one. It was the first time I took pictures of all the cans we found, and I've been doing that ever since and keeping a scrap book on all of my dumping trips. It's really fun looking thru them now and reliving some memorable moments.

This particular hunt was in an area we had hunted earlier that year but ran out of time. We were doing so well that we planned another trip later. The best was yet to come. We were extremely fortunate to have made the second trip. We hunt mainly for beer cans, but are always on the lookout for nice old pop cans too. Having made a super find of Red Fox beer cans earlier that day along with some nice Drewerys series cans, we were driving down an old logging road when we came to a burnt out cabin. The cabin was beyond repair and seemed to have been abandoned for several years. There were two other buildings both without windows and doors and full of junk. I had visions of making a find of mint beer cans, but the only beers we found were common Hamms blue aluminum cans, and only about 6 of them. The smaller of the two buildings was full of old papers, boxes of rags and trash and ALAS, some mint Shasta orange flat tops. I ended up finding 14 orange and 3 grape cans. The only other pop related items were found in the larger of the buildins, thousands of old bottle caps, the older type with the cork backing. Up until that time the only other mint cans I had ever found were 9 Strohs flats and 6 Drewrys white shields. Since that Shasta find I have been on many hunts, but I never found any more old mint cans. Two years ago I took a friend back to that place in hopes of finding a few more rummaging thru the trash, but upon entering the shed we were met by a swarm of bees who had taken residence there. Needless to say we ran out and never looked back.

Since I found those Shastas I have been drawn to the Shasta brand and I have found there are a great many different labels and variations in the flat tops. It is a very interesting brand to work on and collect.

Clemson Orange Soda Commemorates Season

CHERAW (AP) — The top-ranked Clemson University football team's favorite color is orange and the team, coincidentally, is heading for the Orange Bowl on New Year's. So, what could be more natural than Clemson Orange Soda?

The bubbly comes in a distinctive orange can and commemorates the Tigers' 11-0 season. It has a purple tiger paw emblazoned on it and side panels heralding Clemson's winning season and the Orange Bowl bid.

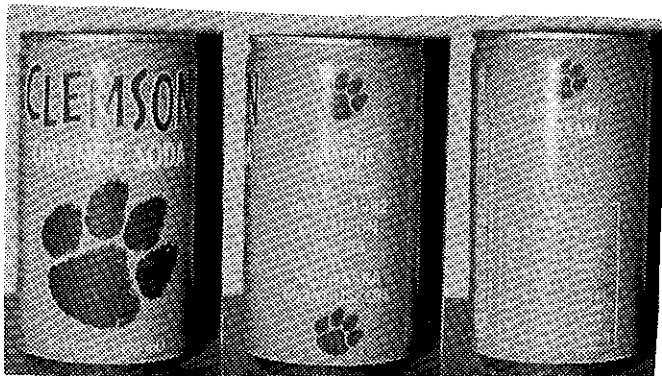
Clemson punter Dale Hatcher of Cheraw was handed the first six-pack of Clemson Orange Soda by Tom Hiles, vice president and general manager of Carolina canners, a

regional Pepsi-Cola distributor based in this rural town.

The soft drink goes on sale around the state Monday.

Hiles says that, at 6 a.m. Friday, trucks from area distributors took just about all of the 5,000 cases of 24 cans each on hand at the plant.

"We're running off 5,000 more cases now, but we hear the Anderson boys are already on their way back for more," he said, referring to distributors from the heartland of Clemson fandom.

CHERAW — It's enough to make a Clemson fan's blood run orange ... fizzy, bubbly, ice-cold orange.

It comes in an orange can and it commemorates the college football team's unprecedented 11-0 season.

Tiger punter Dale Hatcher of Cheraw was given the first six-pack of Clemson Orange Soda by Tom Hiles, vice president and general manager of Carolina Canners, a regional Pepsi-Cola distributor.

The bubbly comes in a distinctive orange can emblazoned with a purple tiger paw and side panels heralding Clemson's season and its bid to the Orange Bowl on New Year's night.

The Tigers will face the Nebraska Cornhuskers in the contest and a Clemson victory would virtually guarantee the school a national football championship.

The soda will be on sale throughout the state Dec. 21 from area Pepsi distributors.

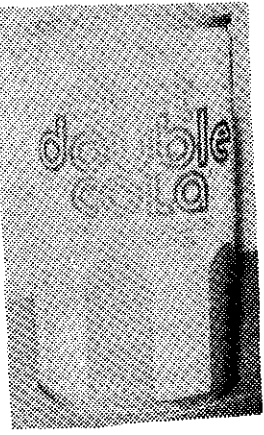
"At 6 a.m. Friday their trucks were here and took just about all 5,000 cases of 24 cans each that we had," reported Hiles happily.

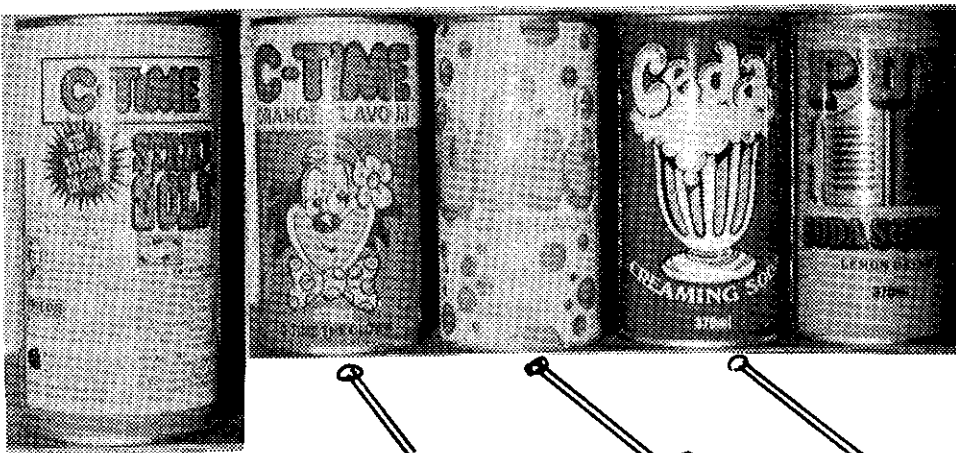

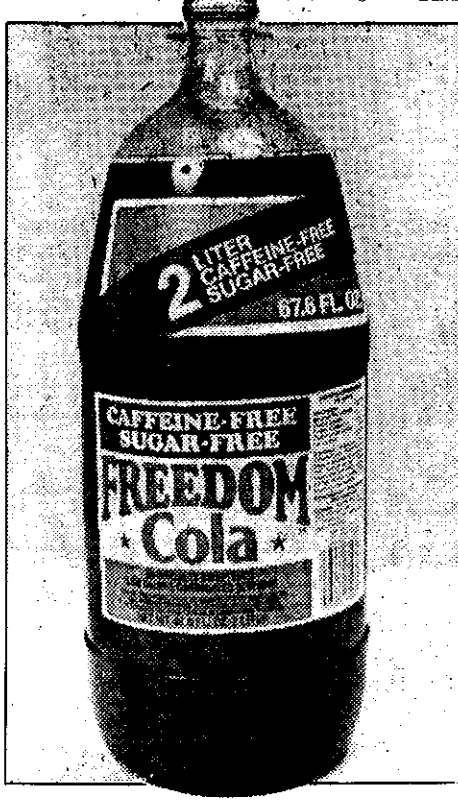

Worry-free cola?

With more and more evidence of the harmful effects of caffeine, a Rochester-based firm decided the time was right for a caffeine-free cola. Carl B. Sutter, vice president of National Brands Beverage Division of Curtice-Burns Inc., said the first production of New Freedom Cola has just been manufactured at the company's Oakfield plant, and is now available locally at Bells Supermarkets. Other supermarket will probably carry it, too. The soft drink, made from a blend of "essential oils and flavorings" developed for National Brands, is also sugar free, and Sutter says it has performed well in taste tests. A two-litre plastic bottle will sell for about 99 cents. In the spring, it may be available in cans, too. It isn't the first caffeine-free cola; Sutter said Sport Cola, a product marketed briefly in the mid-1960s was the first. And RC 100, a more recent development, is also caffeine-free.

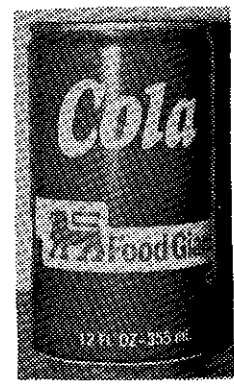

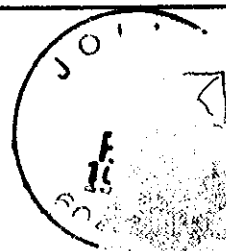
