# Pop Can Collecting May Be for You

*It's contagious and addicting!*

Could you get interested in a hobby that produces a lot of good-natured ribbing, makes you the butt of numerous jokes, and even leads some folks to think that you are a bit off your rocker? If you can stand that kind of response, maybe you could get interested in collecting pop cans.

Seriously, this growing hobby offers lots of fun to retired persons looking for something different to do. Pop can collecting is a fascinating, inexpensive hobby which makes it possible to meet new people, go to flea markets with a sense of purpose, swap nationwide with other collectors, and put all of your friends to work helping with your collection.

I got into pop can collecting when my doctor put me on an extensive walking regime. In attempting to motivate myself, I began picking up cans as I walked, trying to see how many different ones I could find. One can led to another. Now, three years later, I am an avid collector and an active member of the National Pop Can Collectors.

To the uninitiated, all cans may look alike, but to the serious collector there are many variations in construction, size, metals, shape, and openings.

My friends have helped me build my collection. When they go on trips, they bring back unusual local cans. Their names are put on the cans which then go on display on my walls.

There is one drawback to pop can collecting: It's a bulky hobby. You'll need lots of shelves and a vivid imagination as to how best to display your cans attractively. The

person with a full basement is fortunate. Also, being able to build your own shelves will help cut expenses. (Having an understanding spouse is essential!)

The hobby doesn't keep you in the house, either. On warm days you can get out and join other collectors in prowling old dumps and out-of-the way places.

With a challenge of thousands of cans to collect and little space to put them, many collectors specialize. Some collect only one flavor. (I specialize in colas.) Others gather only cans promoting sports personalities, commemorative cans, foreign cans, special flavors, or one of a brand. Some specialize in collecting varieties and variations of one national brand. But, once you fall in love with cans, it's hard to turn down any interesting addition.

Lots of pop cans are traveling in the mail, and perhaps someday you'll look forward to receiving cans from someone in another part of the country. ♦
