Along with the collecting of beverage cans and bottles there is one aspect of the hobby that little information has been made available. This, then involves dumping, or digging through old trash dumps for associated materials that aren't readily available or always available at present markets or on dealers and collectors show tables or trading stock. Some of the old time dumpers will glean a little from this short article, but a lot of newer uninformed collectors who might like to try their hand at dumping, probably will be glad to receive the following pointers in locating trash dumps.

I started dumping about two years ago for old soda bottles and for other salvageable older more scarce cans and other items for my collection. First of all, I will state, anyone who has done any dumping at all knows that it's not easy at times, nor is it fun at all times, but many times the rewards are great. There is a lot of hard work and along with it goes many sore muscles, aching joints, cuts and bruises, as I have found. But I do thoroughly enjoy it and have many, many treasures that I could not have attained otherwise to add to my collection.

Most every individual family has in the past had their own favorite dumping spot or at some time a favorite spot along some roadside for the litterer. Most towns had a local dump area nearby. Larger cities had supervised dumps most of which are covered over for sanitary health and ecological reasons. Most regulated dumps and numerous others have had to be covered over according to Federal Environmental regulations in recent years. So hunt for smaller, older dump areas. There are still many of these sites for the enterprising digger. I personally have had no problems finding these spots (even out of my locality) and I have enough prospective areas to keep me as busy as I desire. Any persons wishing to get involved in this phase of salvage should just start by driving along back roads and out of the way areas in the countryside near riverbeds, abandoned homesites, camping areas, old bridge abutments, old railroad bridges, fill banks leading to bridges, levees for roads across bottom fields or low areas, brushy hillsides, deep hollows and ravines lead-off roadsides. All are tentative dump areas.

Get out of the car and do some scouting on foot, be curious, be persistent. A little serious exploring might be well worth the effort involved, and the results might prove to be astounding. Dumps are everywhere man has been. Some will be small, maybe a bushel or two. While some may hold many truck loads of treasures. Almost all farmers had a dump area on their property (many still do) in an isolated area. I will suggest at this time, it is a good practice to get permission before dumping on private property. Township road officials can tell you where most of the dumps are or were, in their jurisdiction. Another good indicator of a dump site is the posting of NO DUMPING signs, as we all know, no one ever pays attention to these signs anyhow. These signs are usually an indication that trash has been deposited here in the past.

A number of my favorite dumps are located along old abandoned mine roads and on the shale slopes of the mining areas, most of these I have found have been at least 20 years old. I also have discovered two old closed township dumps of the flat top era. I have made many unusual finds.

So fellows and girls, if you want to dump, effort and perseverance will prevail. The treasures are there for the taking or digging as I can testify to. Just get out and look around, eyes on the ground, and join the rest of the clan of dumpers.

I know at least one N P C C member has gained from my coaching. He has finally found his first obsolete cans in a dump near Garland, Texas. I'm hoping that the few pointers I have given here will help a few other potential dumping candidates get on the road (no pun intended) to success. Happy hunting. Tally Ho !!!!
