# A French Soft Drink Hits Bay Area Stores

If French mineral water can make it big in the U.S. market, why, asked Jean Claude Beton and Ted Molakides, can't France's top-selling soft drink?

The only answer that the Marseille manufacturer and the San Francisco distributor could come up with was: Why not?

That was two years ago.

Now making its appearance on Bay Area retail shelves is Orelia, an orange pulp and sparkling water drink, known as Orangina in France, where 600 million bottles are consumed each year.

Beton, who created the beverage 30 years ago from a centuries-old Spanish recipe, and Molakides, whose family-owned Golden Brands is one of San Francisco's leading beer distributors, became acquainted through Golden Brands' highly successful handling of the Northern California Perrier franchise.

Based on per-capita sales, San Franciscans are the biggest drinkers of Perrier water in the country.

"It seemed appropriate," Beton said here yesterday, "that Orelia should make its U.S. debut in San Francisco."

Unlike the limited scope of the arrangement with the producers of Perrier, Golden Brands will have distribution rights for Orelia in 13

states and next year, in addition to distributing the drink, will begin producing it "somewhere on the West Coast."

"We have set up a new subsidiary, Orelia West, and are now negotiating a production contract with several major bottlers and hope to be in operation early next year," Molakides said.

Asked why the original French name, Orangina, was not used, Molakides said plans call for eventually introducing new flavors, other than orange.

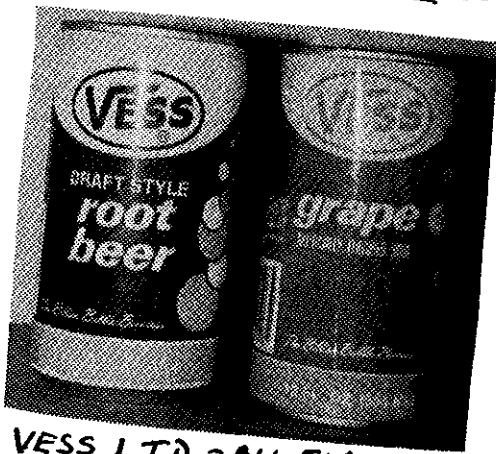
The drink, which comes in a frosted bottle shaped "somewhat like an orange with a neck," contains no additives, artificial flavors or colorings.

"Consumers can tell it's said Molakides, "because they see the orange pulp at the top of the bottle. That's where the slogan - 'Shake me! other soft drink can you tell that calls for shaking?"

Orelia is being tested here in a six-pack of 6.5 bottles, priced at \$2.40.

When domestic prices gets under way next year, bottles are to be replaced in a pack of 9.5 ounce bottles around \$1.60, and a 23-ounce bottle, about 70 cents.

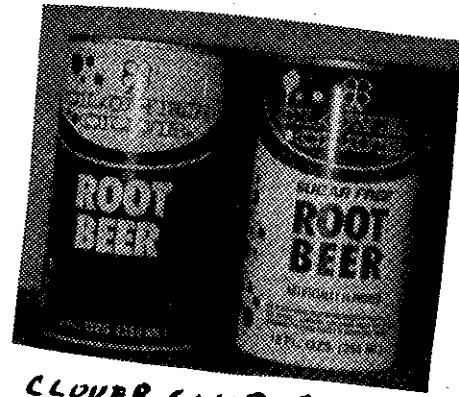

received this itinerary from Bill & Wilma Hill about their recent trip to the Orient. Our trip was fabulous and the weather was with us all the way as it did not rain only on the first night in Peking, China. However, it cleared up and no rain was to be seen for the rest of our excursion.

We flew Korean Airlines to Seoul from Los Angeles, it was a 12 hour flight. We spent two days in Seoul then continued on to Hong Kong spending two days there also. Boarding a China Airlines flight to Peking was our next stop. Here we visited The Great Wall, the Forbidden City, Mings Tomb, Tienamen Square and we also saw the pandas at the zoo. After three days we flew to Shanghai. While we were there we visited a "commune" and took a boat ride down the Huangpu river to the mouth of the Yangtse. After two days in Shanghai we went to Canton. Boarding a train here we left for Hong Kong. From there we flew Cathay Airlines to Manila, Philippines. We saw the city and took the boat trip to Corregidor. Our total trip was 15 days.

While visiting these countries we picked up these soda cans; Coke & Pepsi in Korea, Coke-Yeos sugar cane drink & Pokka milk coffee drink in Hong Kong, and the following cans from the Peoples Republic of China; orange & Anglia shandy lemonade in Hong Kong, Tarax orange-Watson super cola-Vita of China; pear juice-Haitai pop apple nectar-almond juice-ginseng flower drink & chrysanthemum. I did not find Coke in cans in China, only in bottles. We did drink Coke in China and a lot of orange soda and beer. We did not drink any tap water except that which was served in restaurants. We managed to stay healthy and enjoyed our trip immeasurably.

From Carr Suter, two different Coke varieties have been found in his area stores, both with & without the gold "Pull tab to play" tops. One has the ingredients vertically on the side, and the other has a small "Coca-Cola" horizontally at the top of the panel rather than the bottom.

" Trash-cans, bottles and more trash "

I have located another dump area. This dump, to my knowledge, is the first so-called Vance Township dumping ground and at the time of it's operation was managed and overseen by the township road commissioner at that time, Mr. Lawrence Smith. He supplied the top-soil for covering the site and used the township equipment for leveling of the dump area. This dump had ceased operation about 25 years ago.

As yet I have not found any pull tab type cans at this site. The area was closed to dumping during the flat top era. I had found this area in early 1980 and began examining the surface for tell-tale signs of the contents. Several flat top beer cans and flat top Canada Dry sodas were seen along with an old white 7 UP and an orange & white banded Nehi soda can. At the furthest end of the site some rusted out cone tops were found (grade 95). Many different kinds of ACL soda bottles were located, but most of them were broken. To me the site appeared to be very promising, although the size of the area and the apparent enormous bulk appeared to be an unforbidding task.

I looked around the site and decided to start on the lower faces of the dump which ended at two converging draws next to a drop off into the Salt Fork river. At this point I had begun my excavating where the fill was abrupt and where I could just dig and drag the overburden down behind me. This seemed to work very well for me. I haven't worked this area for about a year now due to a bad shoulder but while I was digging I came up with lots of broken stuff (as usual), I assembled about a quart of old marbles, some old Schlitz flat tops, several old milk bottles, as yet none of the soda cans have been salvageable except the cans found at the surface. ACL soda bottles found so far are; Ju-See, Southway, Mil-Kay, Hinners, Upper 10 and SunDrop. From these I found few complete bottles. Most of the bottles were crushed by the road graders used to level off the site.

So, it's a lot of work, hard and dirty, many times with more effort than rewards. But I think the rest of you "treasure hunters" know what I mean.

To end my trip this time, I had a piece of glass go through my boot and into my instep giving me a sore foot for several days along with aching muscles, but I healed in both mind and spirit and I'll go back for more.
