SODA POP CAKE

cup shortening 7-ounce) bottle cherry pop teaspoons baking powder teaspoon salt stiffly beaten egg whites cup chopped nuts (optional)

ream shortening and sugar. Mix dry inredients and add alternately with pop. Fold in egg whites and nuts. This can be baked in three layer cake pans, or a 9 x 13 x 2 inch pan or in 24 cupcake tins, all to be greased and floured. Oven should be preheated to 325 and bake 20 minutes for layer cake, 30 to 35 minutes for 9 x 13 cake, or 25 minutes for cupcakes.

SODA POP FROSTING

- 3 tablespoons flour
- 1 cup cherry pop
- 1 cup margarine (or shortening) 1 cup sugar

To make frosting, put flour and pop in saucepan 1 teaspoon vanilla and cook on low heat until thick. Cool completely. Cream sugar, margarine or shortening and vanilla. Add flour mixture to creamed mixture gradually. Whip until mixture looks like whipped cream.

NOTE; Other flavors of pop may be used in this recipe, if desired. Also the frosting can be made the evening before so it is completely cool, if it is not completely cooled it will separate when put on the cake, especially if the cake is slightly warm.

Thanks go to Dennis Fewless for this recipe. PS, they say it's great with fruit punch flavored pop.








LBJ's "GLASS CADILLAC"

Of all the antique, or otherwise collectible bottles of recent vintage, wouldn't you know it, sure as everything about the man, LBJ, "Texas Style," left his very own glass Cadillac.


In November, 1960, Lyndon Baines Johnson (of Johnson City, Texas) was elected Vice-President of the United States. So, typically Texan, in the early part of 1961, Ol' Lyndon pitched a savory inaugural B-B-Q at his famed Texas "White House" ranch on the Pedernales River.

For that celebrated occasion, Baines (or "Pains," depending upon one's political fidelity) served 240 special-made bottles of Canada Dry Club Soda to his guests — a terribly unimaginative quantity for a man of his dexterity, considering a third of the countryside now claims to have attended.

The bottles were not unusual in size or shape. However, with a Texas-sized "but": the Red, White, Navy Blue, and Gold-enameled label was startling! It contained the Seal of the Vice-President of the U.S.A. — Eagle and all — prepared especially for the Honorable LBJ.

Regarding the 240 bottles produced for that moment, now captured forever-in-glass as History, approximately 45 were retrieved by astute collectors from the "Little White House" refuse dump; long after a number had been brandished homeward-bound by departing guests. Despite diligent efforts to locate, by horse-trading, "wised-up early," potential buyers of this ware: less than 80 have been accounted for worldwide.

Why LBJ's "GLASS CADILLAC"? Well, as far back as 1973, some owners were refusing a \$100 Bill to let an LBJ Vice-Presidential bottle out of their future-seeing, clenched, big ole hands; hanging on with adamant "Texas-sized" grasps?*
