NEW ISSUES AND NEW CANS

Ed Winters of York, Pa reports a new brand in his area, HIGH ROCK, the cans are exactly the same as the SUBURBAN brand with the scenes. At present only orange and root beer are in the markets. It is canned by Allegheny Pepsi of Baltimore.....

From the Hudocks, news of a new brand found while vacationing out East. The brand is called "Stayung" and is only available in diet, orange, ginger ale, root beer, black cherry and strawberry cream. Made by Old Fashion Inc of Wilkes-Barre Penna.

Fran Timoney advises that British American has a new label on all flavors. Found at Old Chicago, Wild West lemonade, Taylor Maid 9½ oz chocolate drink.. Found at South Bend, new Rex root beer, L'Citra an old orange soda made by Duffy's of Denver also a new Harvest Day out of California, and a new Soda Barrel.

Mark Morris writes of a new Dr Wells, a red can with maroon geometric curves and more modern lettering, this can is prepared by Warrenton Products of Warrenton, Mo..(thanx for the can) Mark uses some beautiful Coca-Cola stationary, must work for Coke?

Ed Winters states "there is a new 7 UP can which is completely different than the current can" We will try to get more info on this.

Kyle Harrison informs us that Tru-ade is now marketed in lemonade & fruit punch non-carbonated flavors in his area. He also states that the new Camellia cans are sold in the Belo stores in the Norfolk area of Virginia

OLD CHICAGO

The session at Old Chicago was very successfull to me personally, I was unable to set up but I still aquired some cans for my collection. At this session I met many more of our members Jay Summers, Lyle Riggin, the Domengets, the Conrads, the Blinks, the Paxsons, the Detinas and some other nice people.

There are undoubtedly many more Coke memorabilia collectors than there are pop can collectors, so the Coke cans we as pop can collectors have in our collections should be especially prized collectors items.

Development of cans for Cokes was begun as early as 1940 when a 16 oz. and a 32 oz. cone top was introduced in the market for testing. World War II with its resulting materials shortage brought testing to a halt. Information as to whether either of these cans were actually sold and therefore accessible to collectors is not readily available.

In 1959, the familiar 12 oz. flat with the "Big Diamond" was test marketed in New England and California. General acceptance resulted in nationwide distribution in 1960. At least two variations of this can exist. One can has written under the name in the diamond the words "Trade Mark" and is the more common variety. The other can has "REG. U. S. PAT. OFF." written under the name. Also, in 1960, under the Coca Cola Export Corporation, the "Big Diamond" can was made available in Japan and other markets in the Pacific area.

In 1963, the picture of the bottle was added to the "Big Diamond" for the first major design revision of the earlier punch top can. The transition to the tab top also occurred after this change and tabs were introduced with the new design in 1964. Paint type on these cans account for four collectible variations. Either a flat red or a metallic red was used for both the punch and flat top cans. All four of these variations had the contents (12 oz.) at the top and bottom in a bold print. The fifth variation in this style which is rather rare has the words "Contents 12 FL. OZ." at the bottom.

A major design change occurred in 1966 with the introduction of the "Small Diamond" cans. Most of this design was of the tab variety, but some were marketed with the punch top and can be found for collections.

In another article, we'll take a look at the many varieties of tab top Coke cans that you can add to your collection.

6 oz cone tops, I feel these little cans are a plus to anyones collection. We have found these available in two different styles of Dr Pepper, C & C Super in various flavors and C & C Super Coola, also in many flavors.

One of my most prized cans in my collection is a 9 oz C & C Super root beer. This can is the same diameter as the 6 oz but is about 1/3 taller. I have never seen any other flavor nor any other 9 oz cones.

Listed below are the 12 oz cones that we are aware of. We beleive there are many more to be found and recorded.

High Rock by Allegheny Pepsi bottling Co., of Baltimore Md. in three flavors, Root Beer, Orange, Grape; A new label for the Camelia brand dist. by Economy Stores of Norfolk; Tru-Ade Grape by the Tru Ade Co. of Loudonville, N.Y.; a completely new design for Bubble Up, by Allegheny Pepsi Bottling of Balt.,; Sugar Free Sundrop by South Atlantic canners of Bishopville, S.C.; and a brand new soda, "Grand Cru" found in orange (a bottled version of Ginger Ale is also being marketed) by the Sundrop Bottling Comp. of Gastonia, N.C. I have no idea what Grand Cru is or is supposed to mean, but above the name is something that looks like a family seal or crest. Also, I talked with a lady at the Pepsi Bottling company of Newport News and she says that they are going to be marketing Dr. Pepper in 7 oz. sizes in the Norfolk-Newport-Hampton-Portsmouth area in the middle of September. The following cans are being marketed in some parts of Va. with statab tops; Richfood, Yukon, Cragmont, and Dixi, and Chek. Tru Ade Orange now has "Vitamin C Enriched" on the label. I also was lucky enough to find two Zesty flavors in diets, Orange and root beer.
