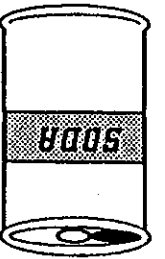

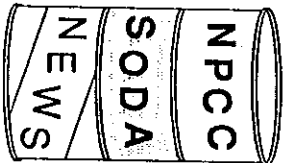

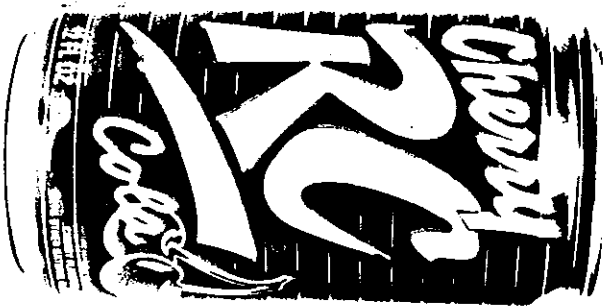
American News

Third in its series of corporate-wide changes, RC Cola has released the artwork for its popular sweet drink, Cherry RC. Diet RC was first to go to the new design, which collectors are referring to as the "Signature Series," in the fall of 1988. Spring of 1989 saw the introduction of traditional RC Cola, and this winter we'll be seeing the new, red cherry cans.

For collectors, the traditional RC "Target Series" design for Cherry RC is relatively short; Cherry RC was introduced in 1985. If your collection lacks this can from your favorite bottler, you better look now before they all disappear.

In an era where all soft drink products "look alike," because of trend to mass produce containers of the same shape, the brands survive only if they have a label with a "...unique visual charm." That seems to be the theory behind the moves by drink makers for changing their cans.

Collectors on the west coast may again see these cans first if the introduction of the previous designs are a gage. All cans are unified in their label with the dominant color divided by white pinstripes. Be sure to let us know when these cans reach your area!


